

trinket tray box

Extra Supplies needed:

- 120 Grit Sandpaper
- Screw Driver
- Baking Paper
- Iron
- Wax to seal your project
- Foil
- Craft Knife
- Heat Gun or Hair Dryer
- Old store card or scraper
- Paint Scraper or something with a strong straight edge

Trinket Tray

1. Give your entire piece of wood a really good sand, including the edges.
2. Dampen your chux cloth and pop out some Voodoo Gel Stain – Tobacco Road and wipe over the front and back of the wood piece. Let dry.
3. Taking your wax puck, rub all over the front of your tray. This acts as a resistance to help with the steps later.
4. Give the front and back a coat of Fluff and let dry. Give the back a coat of Fluff and let dry.
5. Then give the front a coat of Fluff and let semi dry.
6. Then using your paint scraper gently scrape off the paint to create a faux barn wood effect. Be careful not to push too hard and indent the wood. Keep going until you get a desired effect. If you don't like this look feel free to distress instead.
7. Let the paint completely dry and sand lightly to smooth out any raised parts.
8. Using your scissors cut out around the floral design on the decoupage paper and set aside.
9. Place on your tray and line up towards the top right hand corner to ensure that there is enough room for your blessed stencil.
10. Taking your scraper or old store card, burnish the blessed stencil. Carefully remove the backing paper and apply to your tray.
11. Remove the transfer paper. Pop out some coal black and lightly stencil. Let dry.
12. Remove the stencil and any letter inserts with your craft knife.
13. Give the entire front a coat of tough coat and while it is still wet carefully apply the floral decoupage paper, smoothing out any crinkles as you go. Let dry and apply a second coat.
14. Seal the back as well.

15. Attach the handles using the handles from your box and use a screwdriver to tighten.
16. If you find that you get a some crinkles in your decoupage paper, place some baking paper over the design and using your iron to iron out any crinkles. Be sure to have your iron set on NO STEAM.
17. Pop the furniture protectors on the bottom where the screws are.

Now it's time to pop your perfume or favourite jewellery on your new trinket tray and enjoy
